

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case by case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration the individual circumstances, whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and



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any other relevant information. Generally, we will not be able to refund payments made for items purchased or costs that have already been paid where those funds have already been transferred to a third party.

Due to the need to pre-book venues and buses, the school has a 'no refund' policy for camps, sports and excursions/incursions, which will be clearly stated on all forms. (NOTE: Under extreme circumstances the Principal can authorise refunds – this may require a medical certificate or similar).

FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES
